About the In Business programme

There are an estimated 800,000 adults with learning disabilities of working age, of which only 11% have a paid job, often a part time one. Despite this, many people express an interest in exploring work opportunities. One less frequently explored option is that of self employment.

The In Business project set out to explore the route to self employment and small business ownership for those people with learning disabilities interested in an alternative path to work.

It sought to capture the journey to enterprise with particular focus on innovation, business planning and development and service delivery change.

In Business piloted a number of sites across England that reflected Local Authority and Voluntary Sector settings as well as urban and rural economics.
